Theme: Pathways of the World

Concepts: Migration and Change

During our guided reading sessions we will be focusing on developing the children's fluency and comprehension. We will be applying skills of summarising, making inferences and justifying answers with evidence in the text.

During this theme we will be considering what migration is and the social, political, economical and cultural factors impacting migration.

We will consider push and pull factors, and how migration can impact on the change in a location, including Dubai. We will be applying geographical skills such as map reading, identifying features of a location and identifying change over time.

This term in Year 5 we will be covering:

- Statistics
- Number and Place Value
- Addition and Subtraction
- Multiplication and division

During term 1 we will use the recall of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division facts to complete more challenging calculations.

Children will be given opportunities to develop a deeper understanding of these concepts through reasoning and problem solving activities.

We will develop spelling and grammar skills

four key areas of spelling: phonological, visual, morphemic and etymological.

Scientific enquiry skills will be developed in Year 5 through learning about:

- · the differences in the life cycle of a mammal, an amphibian, an insect and a bird.
- the life process of reproduction in some plants and animals.
- the changes as humans develop to old age

- Provide solutions for the problems suffered by the people in his/ her country

- Self-respect
- Tolerance.

We will also consider growing up and the importance of maintain wellbeing; including ways of doing this.
